



Kem Frost is Chief Justice of the Court of Appeals for the Fourteenth District of Texas. Appointed to the court in early 1999 by then-Governor George W. Bush and elevated to Chief Justice in 2013 by then-Governor Rick Perry, she is the longest-serving justice on the Houston-based courts of appeals. Before taking the bench, she enjoyed a fifteen-year civil trial and appellate practice, first as an associate in the Houston office of Liddell, Sapp, Zivley, Brown & LaBoon (now Locke Lord, L.L.P.) and then as a shareholder with Winstead, P.C., working in the firm's Houston office. She holds an LL.M in Judicial Studies from Duke University School of Law, a J.D. from Texas Tech University School of Law, and a B.A. in Government and a B.B.A. in International Business from The University of Texas.
