



Professor Lisa McElroy has published extensively in the field of legal pedagogy and she is an experienced teacher of legal writing. She is a member of the Legal Writing Institute Board of Directors and previously served on the board of the Association of Legal Writing Directors.

After earning her J.D. cum laude from Harvard Law School, she practiced with the Boston law firms of Testa, Hurwitz & Thibeault and Gadsby & Hannah, LLP.

She contributes regularly to The New York Times Motherlode blog and is the author of numerous books for children about Supreme Court justices and prominent elected officials.
