



Robert Henry is a former U.S. judge and politician from Oklahoma who is the 17th and current President of Oklahoma City University. He earned his undergraduate (with high honors) and law degrees from the University of Oklahoma in 1974 and 1976 respectively. While attending law school, he was elected to the Oklahoma House of Representatives.

Mr. Henry formerly served as the Attorney General of Oklahoma from 1986 to 1991, before resigning early in his second term to become the Dean of the Oklahoma City University School of Law, where he remained until 1994. President Bill Clinton appointed Robert Henry as a judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit, a position he held until he resigned in 2010 to return to Oklahoma City University as president.

He was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree from Oklahoma City University in 2000 and an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters from the University of Tulsa in 2006.

Mr. Henry has presented numerous lectures at law schools in the U.S. and abroad, including the 2010 Madison Lecture at New York University and the 2011 Pedrick Lecture at Arizona State University School of Law. His scholarship has been published in numerous law reviews and by the university presses of Oxford, Nebraska, and Oklahoma. He has also published widely in magazines and newspapers.
